Singh, Collector Kota (Rajasthan) To, The Commissioner, Kota Division, Kota (Rajasthan) /  $\frac{1}{4}$ Sub: Detailed information of damage caused by rain and flood. Dear Sir,  $\frac{1}{2}$ With reference to your letter No. 224-F / 098 of March, 14, 2010, regarding the damage caused by heavy rains  $\frac{3}{4}$ and floods in the Banas Nadi, I have/ the honour to you I have now received detailed reports from the patwaris of several villages. The damage inflicted // is so considerable that about 1 half the huts of the village Rampur have disappeared and about one quarter of the / populated part of the village Rasidpur is buried under water. These two villages have suffered the greatest damages, though report from / other six

villages are also very pathetic. Two hundred and thirty persons	
are reported as dead, eighty nine missing while one / hundred	$1\frac{3}{4}$
and fifty nine have been admitted to local hospitals. The poor	
cultivators have lost their huts, standing crops and cattle //	2
and are now a miserable state.	

Relief camps have been opened in all these villages and rescue work is in full swing. / Free distribution of food and clothes has also been undertaken, but the resources are not in proportion to the / need. There is a great need of some official assistance, in various shapes and forms without which adequate help cannot / be given to the suffering villagers. The Sewa Samity Association and Human Life Saving Society are doing excellent work. Many // N.G.O's and private relief societies are working for the help of suffering people of these villages. They are / arranging medicines, food, shelter to live in and distributing clothes etc. Everybody of the neighbouring villages is open heartedly working / and helping the affected people. But they want more help from the government.

I am of the opinion that the / government machinery  $3\frac{3}{4}$  should be moved to launch a more vigorous relief campaign without loss of time.
